

Domestic Violence Advisement

1. Although a person alleged to have committed domestic violence may have been taken into custody, that person may be released from custody at any time.
2. For information relating to an alternative shelter location or other community resources refer to the reverse side of this pamphlet.
3. If you have been the victim of an assault or other related conduct, you may request the District Attorney's Office may be contacted at (714)834-3600.
4. As a victim of domestic violence, you have the right to go to Superior Court for relief to obtain a restraining order by contacting the Victim/Witness office at (714)935-7956.
5. You have the right to file a civil suit for losses sustained as a result of the abuse. For additional information contact Victim/Witness Assistance Program at (714) 935-7956.

SEXUAL ASSAULT ADVISEMENT

Dear Citizen,

You have just undergone a very traumatic situation. You may be a victim of domestic violence or sexual assault, and as such, are entitled to certain rights and information.

This pamphlet is meant to supply you with a number of referrals which may be of use.

It also lists some legal sources and health care facilities. But most importantly, this pamphlet lists your right as a victim of a violent crime and is your first record of contact with the UCI Police Department. If you are confused as to your rights please feel free to contact this department at (949)824-5223.

If you have been sexually assaulted and/or are in danger, find a safe place and seek assistance. Call the police, dial 911, or a local rape crisis center listed within this pamphlet.

1. Find a safe place and seek assistance by calling the police, dial 911, or a local rape crisis center listed within this pamphlet.

2. **DO NOT** change your clothes, **DO NOT** wash, shower, bathe, douche, comb your hair, or eat or drink anything. **DO NOT** touch, move, destroy, or discard anything at the scene of the crime. This is important for evidence collection.

3. The police and/or your local rape crisis center will assist you in seeking medical attention to determine and/or rule out internal injuries that you may not feel. By obtaining medical attention you can receive follow-up care for determining pregnancy and possible sexually transmitted disease.

4. The police will gather and collect evidence from the crime scene, locate the suspect, and make an arrest if possible. Only hospital/medical persons will gather evidence from your person in total privacy at the hospital.

5. If you can recall anything descriptive about your attacker, write it down if possible. Include such items as: race, age, hair and facial hair, clothing description, height and weight. If a car is involved its make, model, color, and year are important as well as direction of travel when the suspect left. Provide witnesses if applicable.

6. Your reported sexual assault will be investigated to its fullest extent and an investigator will be assigned to maintain contact with you throughout the investigation. Your report can be confidential, please speak with the officer.

7. Sexual assault counselors are available 24 hours a day and at your request will respond to the hospital/police department by calling "Sexual Assault Victim Services" (714)957-2737 or the "Orange County Sexual Assault Network" (949)831-9110.

8. Sexual assault is a crime. Sexual assault by someone you know including sexual assault by your spouse is a crime.
