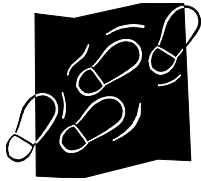

Dear Victim,

You have just undergone a very traumatic situation. You may be a victim of an assault, domestic violence or sexual assault, and as such, are entitled to certain rights and information. This pamphlet is meant to supply you with a number of referrals which may be of use.

It also lists some legal sources and health care facilities. But most importantly, this pamphlet lists your rights as a victim of a violent crime and is your first record of contact with the University of California, Irvine Police Department. If you are confused as to your rights please feel free to contact this department at 824-5223.



If you have been sexually assaulted and/or are in danger, find a safe place and seek assistance. Call the police, dial 911, or a local rape crisis center listed within this pamphlet.

You are taking the right steps.

**IT IS NOT YOUR FAULT, YOU ARE A VICTIM!**

## VICTIMS RIGHTS:

As an assault survivor, you have many service and support options available to you. The UCI campus and the surrounding community has both counseling and support services personnel who understand the trauma and confusion that follows after such an incident. One of the more important support systems available to you is your police department. The officer(s) assigned to your case, if you choose to report, are thoroughly trained to investigate such cases and are sensitive to the pain and anguish you may be suffering. During all phases of the investigation, it is encouraged that you ask the officers questions and be assured that they are working with you in bringing the responsible person to justice. Listed in the pamphlet are legal statues that may be directly related to you and a resource list of organizations and groups available to serve you.

## LEGAL:

California Penal code 293, provides among other things, that police personnel have the responsibility to inform the victim of a sex offense, that his/her name will become a matter of public record unless he or she requested that it not become a matter of public record pursuant to the California Public Records Act which prohibits the disclosure of the address of the victim of any sex crime, as specified.



You do not have to deal with this alone.

California Penal Code Sections 11160 and 11161, requires the hospital emergency room to report information of a sexual assault to the local police department with or without the consent of the victim, however it remains the sole choice of the victim whether he/she wishes to file a police report. Also, a victim of sexual assault has the right to file a police report, but not to press charges.



Let those who care help you rebuild your life.

A stay away order is issued in a criminal case where the probability of victim intimidation exists and violation of such order is a misdemeanor under 166.4 of the California Penal Code.

## THE CARE FOUNDATION

The Care Foundation is a Non-profit Crime Assistance Program of California. They work to protect your rights as a victim and help you receive the compensation that you deserve.

California's Victims of Crime Act provides for compensation of out-of-pocket expenses including:

- Medically related expenses
- Psychological counseling
- Lost wages
- Funeral and burial expenses
- Job rehabilitation
