Details:

UCIPD received a report that a male attempted to grab and kiss a UCI affiliate while she was walking back to her apartment. The UCI affiliate shoved and kicked the suspect. The suspect fell to the ground and the UCI affiliate was able to get away.

Help fight crime by reporting suspicious activity to UCIPD immediately; race, gender, and religious affiliation are not considered suspicious. Dial 9-1-1 for emergency or in progress events. Non - emergency dial (949) 824-5223.

Safety Tips:

- Be aware of people around you. When you are walking, stay alert and tuned into your surroundings.
- If you are being followed, go to the nearest building, office or residence for help.
- If you start to feel concerns about a person or situation, trust your feelings and try to remove yourself as quickly as possible from the potential threat, even if it is someone you know and if it feels awkward to do so.
